



## E-Mail Christmas Cards

This month, we offer you a selection of Christmas cards that can be sent by e-mail. Postage charges have increased dramatically over the past year and Christmas cards themselves are not cheap by any means. So why not use the the selection of cards included in this months OKK Newsletter to save a bit of money? **And, if you feel so inclined, why not share some of your savings by making a donation to Our Kenyan Kids?**



The following page contains thumbnail images showing the main picture and the greeting on the available cards. To download one or more of the cards just click on the thumbnails and the card will download to your web browser. Then right click on the cards you want and select "Save Image As . . ." (your web browser may have slightly different wording) from the menu. Alternatively, you may print directly from the web browser page but this will require you to disable the printing of a header and footer on the page.

The files are all JPEG image files and have been oriented so that you can add a personalized greeting using practically any photo editor from Windows' give-away "Paint" to Adobe's rather expensive "Photoshop". Text is best added under the "Wishing you a Merry Christmas". The more adventurous of you may wish to scan a handwritten greeting - just cut the appropriate section from the scanned image and paste it into the card image.

When sending out the cards, you should include these words in the body of the message:

"This card is intended to be printed out and folded.

"When printing the card, you may ignore the warning that the image is larger that the paper size.

"After printing, fold the page in half parallel to the FOLD 1 guideline. Note that the guide lines may not be exactly at the half-way point because of printer inaccuracies. Then similarly fold parallel to the FOLD 2 guideline so that the main image is on the outer face."

And, of course, you can always print out the cards yourself for giving to family and friends. All cards will fit into "Invitations" envelopes.
